# Day 7: El Viejo Wetlands Cultural Experience

Pickup time: 7:30 am

Hacienda El Viejo is surrounded by sugarcane crops and the most important river in the Blue Zone of Costa Rica, Rio Tempisque. With a house of more than 150 years old and former home to presidents of both Costa Rica and Nicaragua.

#### **Cultural Tasting**

We begin the tour at the "Trapiche" (mill), where we can observe how an ox tied to a yoke makes a "needle" turn, so the cane can fit inside the mill, and this how the juice is obtained. As a part of the experience, we will taste slices of sugar cane and its juice,



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"tapa de dulce" (raw sugar), and of course the sugar cane juice. After we try the sweetest thing, it's time to go to a place that will immediately take us back to the ancient times of old ranches that belonged to families from Guanacaste; a space of culture and learning "La Casa del Sabanero". We will taste the delicious traditional meal of Guanacaste, as we observe how the "tanelas", "empanaditas", and "rosquillas" are baked on a wood oven. All these are prepared with corn, just as our grandmas do! The women at "La Casa del Sabanero" will teach you how to make tortillas as all people do in Guanacaste! Finally, we will drink a delicious coffee or natural fruit juice.

# Rum Experience by Sabandí

Feel the contact with earth and our roots, prepare your senses as we experience the whole process of producing high quality Rum from our purest sugar cane. View the extracting and cooking of the sugar cane juice in an artisanal way, until you reach the

distiller where you will get the first liquors and highest purity. Our Rickhouse awaits your taste buds, which age and improve the flavors of our Sabandí Rum in its oak barrels. The aged Sabandí rum, distilled on premises, boasts its characteristics and differences with each sip. Enjoy the end of the tour with a delicious cocktail made with Sabandí Rum and the stunning views of our lagoon, Relax and enjoy the birds, and peacefulness of the most emblematic haciendas of the last century in the North Pacific of Costa Rica.

# What kinds of clothes should I bring?

Pack light and bring comfortable clothing. T-shirts and shorts are acceptable in San José (during the day, if planning to go out in the evening slacks are highly recommended as some restaurants won't admit you in shorts or sandals). Loose-fitting long-sleeved shirts and pants are recommended if you want to avoid sun. Bring a large hat to block the sun from your face and neck. Pack a light sweater or jacket for the A/C of the bus might get cool. Sturdy sneakers or hiking boots are essential if you plan to do a lot of sightseeing and hiking. Waterproof hiking sandals or other footwear that lets your feet breathe are good for strolling about town, and also for beach walking, fording streams, and navigating the myriad mud holes you'll find on rain and cloud forest trails.

#### How is the weather in Costa Rica?

The climate is idyllic. In the lowlands, which are dry in the Pacific Northwest and humid elsewhere, daytime temperatures range in the eighties to nineties  $F^{\circ}$  (high twenties to mid-thirties C°). Usually in the seventies  $F^{\circ}$  (low to mid-twenties C°) at middle elevations, the mercury can fall as low as the forties and fifties  $F^{\circ}$  (five to mid-tens C°) at the top of the mountains. Costa Rica can be broadly categorized into four major climatic zones:

#### Language

The official language is Spanish, although the tourist will find that English is widely spoken particularly in places such as hotels, travel agencies, banks, rental car companies, restaurants, etc.

#### Time

In Costa Rica daylight savings time is not used, but in order to have an idea of the approximate time of this country, it can be related to the U.S. Eastern Standard Time: From October to April: Costa Rica is one hour behind Eastern Standard Time. From April to October: Costa Rica is two hours behind Eastern Standard Time

#### Electricity

Is the same as in the U.S. 110 volts., 60 cycles.

#### **Credit cards**

All major credit cards are accepted in almost all hotels, stores, restaurants and car rental agencies. Outside San Jose and in some places the tourist should be prepared to pay in local currency; especially if the store, hotel, etc. is planning to include a service charge fee for the use of the credit card.



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### **Policies and payments**

All tours must be prepaid 1 month prior arrival. You can wire the funds to our bank in Miami or pay with credit card. In case of credit card payment there is a service charge of 4% and banks in Costa Rica, in order to protect the costumer, requires a "signature on file form" with a copy of both sides of the credit card.
