Description

Immerse yourself in the many delights that Bahrain has to offer on this full-day excursion. Explore the must-see cultural spots and locations, while you discover interesting snippets of history about the 'Pearl of the Gulf'. Your guide is equipped with the knowledge and experience to showcase each of these places and all they have to offer.

During the morning, you'll visit Al Fateh Mosque and the Bahrain National Museum, followed by the Muharraq Souq, where you can purchase beautiful items such as Bahrain's world-famous pearls, highly acclaimed gold and brightly coloured fabrics.

This exciting morning of culture and history will conclude with a visit to Bahrain Fort – Qal'at Al Bahrain, which with its coastal location offers two beautiful backdrops – the sparkling blue waters and the city skyline.

After stopping for a traditional Bahraini lunch at one of the best restaurants for local cuisine on the island, Sight-seeing continues in the afternoon with the Camel Farm, Bahrain International Circuit, the Oil Fields and the Tree of Life.



AL JASRA HERITAGE

Description

Spend the day taking in the sights of Al Jasra, which features prized local handicrafts and breath-taking old houses including The Late Amir's birth place. You'll have the chance to meet camels at the Royal Camel Farm and get some fantastic pictures with the Saudi Arabia shoreline in the background. Next you'll dine like a local with a delicious traditional Bahraini lunch at a popular local restaurant, before discovering Al Jasra Old Houses, including Beit Al Jasra - a traditional style house built in 1907 and restored in 1986

using traditional building materials such as coral stones, and palm leaf trunks. The unique talents of Bahraini craftsman that have been passed from generation to generation will be showcased at Al Jasra Handicraft Centre, which features pottery making, cloth weaving, wood working and basket weaving. Lastly, you'll visit A'ali Burial Mounds which is one of a number of necropolis areas in the Kingdom dating back to the Dilmun era, and see the beautiful pottery created by local craftsman.






GILGAMESH REVERIE

Description

Bahrain is steeped in history, and this tour is the perfect way to gain insight into the significant development the country has undergone over the centuries. Begin your day with a guided walk through Al Khamis Mosque – one of the oldest mosques in the Arab world. Built around 692 AD, its foundations date back to the 11th century, and its identical twin minarets make it easily recognisable. Afterwards you'll visit Bahrain National Museum which showcases local traditions and customs as well as an exciting array of historical artefacts before stopping for a spot of lunch, where you'll have an authentic experience sampling the best local cuisine. Lunch will be followed by the

awe-inspiring Bahrain Fort – Qal'at Al Bahrain, a UNESCO World Heritage Site that has endured over 4,000 years of continuous occupation. Your knowledgeable tour guide will talk you through the significance and background of the structure and as you explore, you'll find perfect photo opportunities with ideal views of the city skyline and the sparkling blue waters thanks to its coastal location. The last two stops will take you to Barbar Temple - a complex consisting of three successive temples built over five stages, dating back to the second and third millennium BC and A'ali Burial Mounds - one of the necropolis areas which dates back to the Dilmun era.

fresh ingredients and cook up a storm in the kitchen of a local chef before enjoying your masterpiece for lunch. During the afternoon you'll discover the manufacturing processes at Bahrain Dairy and Al Kamel Factory, and visit a private farm where you'll see first-hand the importance of agriculture in the Kingdom.





HISTORICAL PEARLING & FISHING PATH

Take a glimpse at Bahrain's soul, and dive into the country's heritage pre-oil discovery, with a tour that offers unique insight into its internationally famed pearling industry. For over a century, the Kingdom's pearls have been sought after, and one of the most notable appearances is the Bahrain pearl drop earrings gifted to Queen Elizabeth II by The Late Amir.

This is a truly unique opportunity to immerse yourself in the fishing and pearling industries, with a local at the helm who

will guide you through the day-to-day operations. Firstly, you'll visit Bu Maher Fort, before heading to the Shipbuilding Yard in Muharraq where you'll see the majestic Dhow's up close. After, you'll be taken to the Bakers Factory, and have two photo stops, one at the Fish Trap Factory and the second at the Pearl Diving Dock before being invited to join a local pearl diver in a traditional Bahraini restaurant for lunch, where you'll discover how the industry has been passed through the generations.

BOAT TRIP TO HIDDEN GEM

Jarada is a tidal island located 14 kilometres off the coast of Bahrain, only accessible by boat. It provides a picturesque secluded setting to enjoy a day of relaxation, swimming, lunch and plenty of fun with your friends and family. Dive into the crystal-clear blue water, or spend your afternoon soaking up rays on the golden sand. Jarada is a truly idyllic location and a perfect day out for all.

Head out onto the sparkling blue waters surrounding Bahrain

and get a unique and exclusive look at the magnificent city skyline, complimented by the beautiful shorelines. There are wonderful photo opportunities to be had as you float around the island in a comfortable boat and take in the awe-inspiring buildings. Plus, if you're lucky you might get to see some of the dolphin pods that grace the island's waters. The dolphins happily swim quite close to the boat which is fantastic for everyone, but specifically for younger members of the family.
