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
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AQS GOLF AND SAFARI IN KENYA



Day 1 Nairobi

Day 2 Nairobi

Day 3 Nairobi - Masai Mara National Reserve (6hours drive)

After breakfast, safari briefing and depart for Maasai Mara National Reserve offering wonderful scenery and plenty of game in our custom made 4x4 land cruisers. It is perhaps the only region left in Kenya where the visitor may see animals in the same super-abundance as existed a century ago. The reserve has a rich birdlife. Explore the plains and rolling hills for a chance to spot the elephant, black-manned lion, leopard, buffalo,

cheetah, and diverse species of hoofed mammals. Arrive at the Mara Serena Safari Lodge, check in and have lunch. In the afternoon depart for a game drive in the reserve then return to the lodge for dinner and overnight stay.

Day 4 Masai Mara National Reserve

Full day spent game-viewing in the reserve. Explore the plains and rolling hills for a chance to spot the images of your dreams ranging from beautiful scenery to fascinating views of wildlife, in a natural habitat. Morning and afternoon game drives or a full day game drive with packed lunches would take you closer to nature. All meals and overnight at the lodge.

Day 5 Masai Mara National Reserve - Diani Beach

After breakfast, depart for your direct flight to Diani. Met at Ukunda airstrip by our representative and transfer to Leisure Lodge Beach & Golf Resort. Check in and relax. Dinner and overnight at the lodge.

Day 6 and 7 Diani Beach

Full day at the hotel in Diani beach. You have the option of playing golf or enjoying many excursions to marine parks, traditional villages, Mombasa city and nearby game reserves proposed by our team.

Destination Information

Kenya

Kenya has a warm and humid tropical climate on its Indian Ocean coastline. The climate is cooler in the savannah grasslands around the capital city, Nairobi; especially those closer to Mount Kenya, which has snow permanently on its peaks. Further inland are highlands in Central and Rift Valley regions where tea and coffee are grown as cash crops which are major foreign revenue earners. In the West are Nyanza and Western regions, there is an equatorial, hot and dry climate which becomes humid around Lake Victoria, the largest tropical fresh-water lake in the world. This gives way to temperate and forested hilly areas in the neighboring western region. The north-eastern regions along the border with Somalia and Ethiopia are arid and semi-arid areas with near-desert landscapes. Kenya is known for its world class athletes in track-and-Field and rugby. Thanks to its diverse climate and geography, expansive wildlife reserves and national parks such as the East and West Tsavo National Parks, Amboseli National Park, Masai Mara, Lake Nakuru National Park, Aberdares National Park and white sand beaches at the Coastal region, Kenya is home to the modern safari and has several world heritage sites such as Lamu and a number of beaches, including in Diani, Bamburi, Watamu, Malindi and Kilifi, where international yachting and big game fishing competitions are held every year.







Location and Park Information

Nairobi

Nairobi is the capital city of Kenya. The largest and most populous city in East Africa, with a current estimated population of about 4.5 million, Nairobi started life as a railway's depot in 1899. Today, the city skyline is dominated by modern high-rise buildings and is a tourism and trade hub. Nairobi is now one of the most prominent cities in Africa politically and financially. A vibrant city with a mix of races and cultures, providing the visitor with several sightseeing options such as museums, a national park, golf courses, resorts and posh night clubs. Nairobi is one of the leading cities in Africa.



Masai Mara National Reserve

Covering an area of over 1,500 square km, the Masai Mara National Reserve is one of the most popular tourism destinations in Kenya. The reserve is located between the Great Rift Valley and Lake Victoria in primarily open grassland. The swampy land provides more access to water and less access to tourists. The eastern end is closest to Nairobi and hence easier to access by tourists.

The Masai Mara is regarded as the jewel of Kenya's wildlife viewing areas. There have been some 95 species of mammals, amphibians and reptiles and over 400 bird species recorded on the reserve. Nowhere in Africa is wildlife more abundant, and it is for this reason a visitor hardly misses to see the big five (buffalo, elephant, leopard, lion, and rhino).



Diani Beach

With swaying palms and soft, white sand caressed by glittering, turquoise water, Diani Beach has many of the ingredients of the perfect tropical holiday destination. It is deservedly popular, and as one of Kenya's premier Indian Ocean resorts, it has a large and still-growing assortment of hotels and restaurants, some of them extremely luxurious by local standards. It is also one of the best places to get eye to eye with the richly diverse marine life of the southern Kenyan coast, by snorkelling, scuba-diving or joining a boat safari. The beach is the area's major attraction - long, soft, white and lovely, it comes close to the tropical ideal. The romantically inclined can cruise the shoreline in a dhow (traditional boat).
